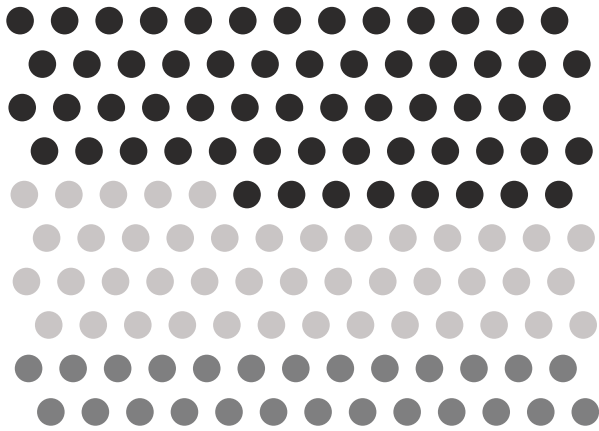
The number of patients accessing primary care and behavioral health services more than doubled between 2012 and 2016.

In 2016, we served 3,300 patients living with HIV, a **3%** increase from the previous year. **1,614** patients initiated PrEP, a once-daily medication that can reduce your risk of getting HIV, representing a **45%** increase in patients accessing PrEP since 2015. We currently have **2,100** patients on PrEP. Likewise, **388** patients accessed PEP, a medication that can prevent HIV from infecting your body if taken within 72 hours of exposure. Howard Brown links **94%** of patients with positive HIV results to care within 90 days, and our HIV viral load suppression rate is **82%**.

Howard Brown envisions a future where the health and wellness of LGBTQ people are affirmed with healthcare as a human right; where progressive social policy uplifts the lives of LGBTQ people; and where affordable, accessible and culturally competent care from non-judgemental healthcare professionals is available to all who seek it.

EXPANDED FOOTPRINT

We have 7 clinic locations spanning 20 miles from Rogers Park to Englewood, with an 8th location, Howard Brown Health Diversey opening in September at 2800 N. Sheridan. Our clinics are located in Rogers Park, Edgewater, Uptown, Lakeview, Englewood, and Hyde Park. One of our sites, the Broadway Youth Center (BYC), offers healthcare and social services for LGBTQ and homeless youth ages 12-24. Howard Brown also operates Brown Elephant resale stores in Oak Park, Andersonville, and Lakeview. Our central administration operates from an office in Uptown.

OUR COMMUNITY

Our reproductive and sexual health services include STI/HIV screening, HIV specialty care, PrEP and PEP, family planning, and more. Services for people with cervixes include gynecological care, chest/breast health, and cervical cancer screenings, colposcopy, alternative insemination assistance, and referral.

We have many services tailored to specific groups, such as transgender healthcare, programs for LGBTQ youth and seniors, and support for LGBTQ sexual assault survivors. Our individualized behavioral health services focus on addictions, intimate partner violence, chronic disease management, and smoking cessation. Howard Brown's education, research and advocacy teams train healthcare workers and advance research that informs policy and practice. Howard Brown is participating in 11 clinical trials, with about 50 patients enrolled at any given time.

- ✕ helps cover to \$4 million in uncompensated care provided annually to uninsured patients to help reduce the health disparities experienced by LGBTQ people and allies.
