This year's Midwest LGBTQ Health Symposium (MLHS) equips healthcare providers with the skills they need to better serve the LGBTQ community with quality care. While affirming healthcare for LGBTQ people is accessible, there are still racial, social, and economic inequities that must be addressed and overcome. The sessions for this year's MLHS were specifically selected to help address health disparities within LGBTQ communities.

Armando Ramirez has been a member of the Howard Brown Health Community Advisory Board (CAB) for over three years. Coming from a Latinx background, Armando joined so that the Latinx voice could be represented.

Living with HIV, Armando is very involved in the community and uses Howard Brown as a platform to inform the Latinx community about the services that we offer. "I mention to friends and family all the important things Howard Brown does for everyone, not just the LGBTQ community," says Armando.

When asked about his favorite part of being a CAB member, Armando said, "Knowing what goes on behind the scenes at Howard Brown and what they do for the community gives me lots of pride in being part of an organization that is doing everything possible to help. When I was first diagnosed as living with HIV, Howard Brown was the only organization that helped me, and because of them, I am the person I am today and I am grateful for it."

New Suboxone Program

Assistance for people with opioid addiction

Suboxone is a medication used for the treatment of addiction to heroin, prescription pain medication, or other opioids. It can reduce cravings and help people stop using. Any client of Howard Brown Health who is actively engaged in medical care and wants help with opioid use is eligible for the Suboxone Program. Our team provides support throughout the program. If you have needs or barriers that would stop you from participating in the program, the Suboxone Coordinator can assist you with resources, referrals, and transportation cards for appointments.


